The Youth Zone was buzzing as people arrived, and every room was open with young people eager to share the activities they love doing.

# WE'VE COME TO INVEST IN THE FUTURE OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE >


(STUART LEVY, INCOMING CHAIRMAN)

# FAREWELL KEITH...

After eight incredible years, Keith Black stepped down as Chairman of Unitas in February 2024.




It was Keith who was originally approached by OnSide to head up the nascent Barnet Youth Zone (before Unitas got its name!). His drive and passion helped convince Barnet Council to green-light the project and an amazing community of business people and philanthropists to get on board, ultimately leading to the opening of Unitas in June 2019.

Since then, Keith has chaired the Board of Trustees and overseen the enormous successes we have had in our first four-and-a-half years of operation, including over 150,000 visits by more than 12,500 young people.

Keith steps down with Unitas in a strong position. He has accepted the Trustees' invitation to become our Honorary President and will continue to act as an ambassador for Unitas, as well as offering advice and support. Unitas is 'the house that Keith built' and his achievements are marked by a plaque erected at the entrance to our building.

### ... AND HELLO STUART

We are delighted that, after an open application process, the Trustees appointed Stuart Levy to be the new Chairman of Unitas, taking up the role in February 2024. Stuart and his family



have supported Unitas since we opened. He and his brother own a chain of luxury 4\* and 5\* hotels, along with a film studio.







#### UNITAS CELEBRATES ST PATRICK'S DAY ENERGETICALLY!




At Unitas, our young people come from diverse backgrounds and we make an effort to honour and celebrate their cultures.

# POTTERY CLUB

We recently kicked off our brand-new pottery club with support from the FiredUp4 project. Staff members went through an exclusive training session where they learned to operate a kiln, some basic clay techniques, how to hand build, and how to throw a cup.



Delivered on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, we expect these sessions to become an important part of our offer, opening opportunities for young people to find a new passion and develop a new skill.

# OUR YOUNG PEOPLE WERE EAGER TO GET THEIR HANDS DIRTY

From the moment we launched the activity, our young people were eager to get their hands dirty, with the Juniors crafting Easter ornaments out of clay and our Seniors practicing their dexterity on the wheel.

Both groups have now had time to create some truly beautiful pieces in a laid back and friendly environment, accompanied by Blanca, the Art Room Lead, and Olga, the Sessional Art Specialist.

We are excited to see what talents develop and what this new opportunity represents for the art department at Unitas.

As pottery is typically a niche and expensive hobby, offering it at Unitas makes it accessible to young people who would not otherwise have discovered the craft and could lead to an increase in new members. The more, the merrier!

## RICHARD'S STORY

Growing up in the local area, life was sometimes tough.

I'm the youngest in my family and all my siblings are really academically smart - there was a lot of pressure on me. The way I learnt to cope was to always smile - if I smiled at the world, the world would smile back. That was great some of the time, but I would get upset or angry and not really know what to do with those emotions.

I've never been good at finding the words for how I feel. Looking back, I didn't have much self-confidence.

When I was in year 10, there was an assembly at my school. They told us that this new youth centre, Unitas, had opened and that we should come down and check it out. I always loved playing sport and would spend all my free time in local parks. We used to get bored so the idea of a new youth centre really appealed.

#### Unitas had everything!

When I first walked in, I thought "WOW! This is amazing!". Unitas had everything! I tried all the activities, and was particularly proud of myself when I got to the top of the climbing wall for the first time. I remember that I used to come through the doors and immediately feel relaxed. I was somewhere safe, fun and where I could be myself.

Basketball became my life. I love the game and I love the friends here at Unitas that I play with. The sight and sound of the basketball court makes me so happy.


The youth workers encouraged me to take training more seriously, so now I have a solid routine. It is good for my health, it improves my skills at basketball but it also gives me an outlet for my emotions. Now, when I am angry or upset, I don't need to bottle it up. I have a positive, healthy way to cope and feel much more resilient than when I was younger.

#### Tania has been so important to me

One youth worker in the Sports Hall, Tania, has

been so important to me. She really 'sees' me, and is always available if I need to speak. I don't think I'm exaggerating when I say she has helped me to understand myself more clearly than before.

I'm 19 now and have a job. I am looking forward to my future, confident that I can do whatever I put my mind to, as long as I work hard and stay healthy. Unitas has been a massive part of my life and I'm so grateful to all the staff who make it the amazing place that it is.
