CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENT JACK PETCHEY AWARDS

Your hard work, kindness and determination inspire us all!

Every year, our young people are recognised through the Jack Petchey Achievement Awards. This is a special honour that celebrates effort, determination and positive contribution. Unitas Youth Zone allocated the most Jack Petchey Achievement Awards in Barnet (18 per year).

Each award tells a story of confidence gained, barriers overcome and acts of kindness that make a difference. Winners were nominated by their peers and youth workers for going above and beyond, whether by supporting others, showing leadership, or simply bringing positivity into the room every day.

For many, it was the first time they'd been publicly celebrated for their achievements, a powerful moment that changes how they see themselves. One young person shared, "I didn't think I'd ever win something like this, it's made me want to try even harder."

SPOTLIGHT: Meet Fehin

Every young person deserves the chance to shine and for many that spark begins in our Music and Performing Arts spaces. We caught up with Fehin Akanwo, our talented Music and Performing Arts Coordinator, to learn how she helps young people build confidence and express themselves through music, dance and performance.



What inspired you to work in music and performing arts with young people?

I believe music is one of the most powerful tools of creative expression. Every young person should have the opportunity to explore and express themselves through music. It helps them find their voice and confidence.

How do you use activities like karaoke or dance to help young people come out of their shell?

I use activities like karaoke and dance to encourage self-expression and individuality. When young people take part, they feel empowered. It's a chance to perform one of their favourite songs in front of others and be celebrated for it.

What's a moment that made you proud, when you saw a young person's confidence grow right in front of you?

One of my proudest moments is seeing young people who once watched quietly from the sidelines now step up to the stage and sing their hearts out. Watching that transformation, from hesitant to confident, is incredibly rewarding.

Why do you think creative expression is so powerful for young people today?

Young people often go unnoticed, and their voices can be unheard. Creativity gives them that voice a way to show who they are and what they're capable of. It's empowering and deeply personal.

What's one thing you hope every young person takes away from your sessions?

That it's more than okay to be exactly who you are. There's no right or wrong way to be creative - just your way.

If you could describe the Unitas music and performing arts vibe in three words, what would they be? Creative, inspiring and inclusive.



From lively karaoke sessions to show-stopping dance routines and talent shows that fill our halls with cheers, Fehin creates a space where young people can express themselves freely and build confidence in artistic ways.

With support from partners like Dance Stables, our members learn choreography, explore new rhythms, and gain valuable music training, but more than that, they discover their voice, courage and a sense of belonging.

Week after week, we see shy young people step into the spotlight and walk away with confidence that goes far beyond the stage.

IN FOCUS: Fun, Talent, Teamwork



FRIDAY FUN DAY

We kicked off the summer holidays with Friday Fun Day, packed with games, challenges, inflatables, quizzes and our legendary staff bingo. More than 150 young people joined us to celebrate the end of school and the start of summer. While the day was full of laughter and excitement, its impact went far deeper. Through play, young people strengthened their social skills, built confidence and learned how to work together as a team.

For many, it also created a powerful sense of belonging at a time when the long summer holidays can sometimes feel isolating. Crucially, opportunities like this protect against the decline in wellbeing and social skills that many young people face when they don't have access to safe, structured spaces. In our recent Impact report, we found 95% of high-attending members reported improved self-confidence. Friday Fun Day showed that play isn't just fun, it's a vital part of how young people learn, grow and thrive.





UNITAS OLYMPICS: CELEBRATING TALENT, TEAMWORK AND GROWTH

We hosted a special one-day Olympics event, bringing together young people from across the Youth Zone for a celebration of skill, creativity and teamwork.

Participants took part in a wide range of activities, including sports tournaments, gym challenges, music, art and uniform design, as well as health and wellbeing workshops. The day was full of energy, creativity and friendly competition, giving every participant the chance to try new things and develop their skills.

Prizes were given, but the real win was bigger: a safe, positive alternative to boredom or risky behaviour - space to play, connect and feel supported while building social, emotional and teamwork skills for the future.



A CELEBRATION OF ENERGY, TALENT AND SELF-EXPRESSION AT LIMITLESS GOT TALENT

Our Limitless Got Talent event was buzzing with energy as young people took to the stage to sing, dance, compete in sports challenges, solve puzzles, and show off their unique talents. From start to finish, the event was full of laughter, cheers and unforgettable moments.


More than just a showcase, this was a safe space where participants, especially those with additional needs could be themselves, try new things, and explore their creativity without fear.
